Provenance

This collection of miscellaneous sheet music, musical booklets, and hand-written music was found unprocessed in the museum stacks. It was processed and accessioned in 2013. In 2021 the curator found a deed of gift from Susan Cowles dated 09-23-2011 with a donation of the Hyrum 8th grade 1916 framed photograph (2013.18.74) and a box of music related items listed given in memory of Venita C. Albertsen.

Historical Note

Venita Albertson was born March 17, 1919, in Salt Lake City Utah. At the age of 12, she and her sister Selma were adopted by Levi & Harriett Crowshaw of Hyrum and later sealed to the Crowshaw in the Logan LDS Temple. Venita married Weldon Albertson on October 5, 1948. She was a member of the Hyrum 1st Ward, where she served in many callings, especially anything to do with music. She passed away on May 27, 2011.
