Provenance Note

This collection of records was donated by Janice Barlow, the music specialist at Lincoln Elementary School. These records had originally been in the Lincoln Elementary Library (also known as the Instructional Media Center) before being used in the music classes at the school. The donation also included a record player in order to utilize the records.

Historical Note

The original Lincoln School was built in 1911. In 1935 the school was organized into five departments: music, library, social studies, art, and auditorium. At this time the school library opened with Bessie Brown as the library teacher. An expansion to the school was built in 1968 and the original three-story building was demolished in 1994 due to safety concerns and updated technological needs for the school.

Scope and Content of Collection

This collection contains records that were used by the Lincoln Elementary School music department. The records encompass themes relating to music education, such as classical composers, classical music, and background on types of instruments; children's singalong songs; movement and exercise; folk dances; patriotic music; and classic children's stories. The copyrights of the albums dates between 1945 and 1985, and library checkout slips with the records were mostly in use in the 1960s and 1970s. Some of the records have handwritten notes on the sleeves indicating which songs were used in education. American Folk Dances has a lesson plan written by five Lincoln teachers.
